




Reported Speech Grammar-Use reporting Verbs-Said sth-Told someone Will-would can-could

Conjugations

Imperative Sentences

IMike and Tom "We play football" Mike and Tom told me (that) they played football. I have got a piano lesson today. She said that she had got a piano lesson that day. Put the box here.





Examples

Direct QuestionReported Ouestion

Where is the Post Office, please? She asked me where the Post Office

What are you doing?

She asked me what I was doing. Who was that fantastic man?

She asked me who that fantastic

man had been.

Conjugations

I'll see you later

She said (that) she would see me later.

I would help, but."

She said (that) she would help but...

I can speak perfect English

She said (that) she could speak perfect

could*

I could swim when I was four

She said (that) she could swim when she was

four.

present simple

I like ice cream

She said (that) she liked ice cream.

present continuous

I am living in London

She said (that) she was living in London.

past simple

I bought a car

She said (that) she had bought a car OR She

said (that) she bought a car.

I was walking along the street

She said (that) she had been walking along the

present perfect

I haven't seen Julie

She said (that) she hadn't seen Julie.

I had taken English lessons before

She said (that) she had taken English lessons

before.

USE OF THE PRESENT PERFECT STANDUNTIL

CONJUGATION

Do you know what to do?

She asked if I knew what to do



Time, places and pronoun changes

Simple present ---> simple past Present progressive ---> past progressive Present continous ---> past continous Present perfect ---> past perfect

> go --> went is going --> was going has gone --> had gone went --> had gone had said --> had said

Reporting verbs SAID and TOLD

When we want to report what people say, we use reporting verbs. Different reporting verbs have different patterns, for example:

Peter told her not to worry.

No, she said, "I've never seen it

MAIN **TENSES** INCLUDIND WILL/CAN

Direct speech: "I can swim." In reported speech, as with will, can moves back a tense and becomes could:

• "She told me she could swim."
